Discussion

RecFish SA has managed and run the Reservoir permits system for the past 8 years with great success and without a single complaint or management issue. RecFish SA was informed of the cancelation of the licence on the 17th September 2019 by letter stating that the Government decided to take this back due to the roll out across all Reservoirs which we're already undertaking in conjunction with SA Water.

The new permit system will be run and managed by SA Water through DEW and the funds received from permits will go into the Governments hands with no suggestion that 100% of the money will be spent restocking and better the facilities within the reservoirs for Recreational anglers, remembering that anglers are the only ones to pay an annual permit fee.

At last year's AGM we supported the motion of introducing a Recreational Angling Licence, this year we again support this motion and wish to include the Reservoir permit system within that said licence as long as all permit/licence in managed independently and not by the Government.

To inform all current financial members, RecFish SA has been removed from all Government committee's and advisory groups as part of a directive from the South Australia Government. RecFish SA continues to campaign against this motion through meetings with current South Australian Government representatives, members of the opposition and other politicians. We will continue to fight this and seek to endeavour to be reinstated to all committee's and groups in the near future.



RecFish SA Chairpersons Report 2020

2020 will be a year that we will remember for a very long time, a global pandemic caused major issues for our industry Australia wide, with fishing even being banned in Victoria.

Early in the year we saw the rise of the Ministers Recreational Fishing Advisory Council (MRFAC) who, driven by Minister



Whetstone, wasted no time in having Recfish SA removed as the Peak Body for Recreational Fishing in SA. This resulted in significant change as we were also removed from every council, task force and MAC we sat on and management of the Reservoir Permit Scheme – originally established by RecFish SA, was also taken away from us by government.

Despite these setbacks, RecFish SA continued to grow its brand and most importantly has never stopped representing the angling community of South Australia. We exist so that recreational anglers are represented to government and are given the respect they so deserve when matters of policy are determined. And while we can't claim to win everything we want, we can proudly claim that unlike some others, we have and will always put the best interests of the recreational fishing community first. We can do this with integrity because as we know we have the genuine support of the recreational fishing community and our members that have stuck by us through thick and thin. Thank you to all our wonderful members who shown their unwavering support during these difficult times.

Last year's AGM saw the retirement of long-term board members Michael Sierp, Danny Simpson and Ian Fitzgerald after nearly three decades of amazing service. Ian's efforts to improve recreational fishing in SA were recognised by the Australian Recreational Fishing Foundation (ARFF) at their conference in Hobart where he narrowly missed receiving the Mal Ramsey award for lifetime achievement.

The ARFF Hobart Conference also saw formal recognition of one on RecFish SA's best achievements when it received the award for best recreational fishing project in Australia for the Reservoir Fishery Development project. It is so gratifying to see thousands of anglers and their families enjoying a day out at these terrific fisheries, knowing that RecFish SA started this project well before any efforts by the government. A special mention must go to project manager, Danny Simpson and his magnificent team of David Ciaravolo, Michael Sierp and Ian Fitzgerald in delivering such great outcomes for recreational fishers.

The 2019 AGM also saw the evolution of the Board with the appointment of Josh Davey, Laura Schroder, Lee Van Soest and Neil Hutchins as Directors. It is a testament to the character of these new members to join during such difficult times, yet all have made some very important contributions to our cause and I am glad to say that all are very keen to continue their role in the coming year.



Our young enthusiastic group of directors stepped up to the plate when we needed them and we were able to make a submission to the select committee for what we have nick named the "Kakadu of the South", a fishing trail that would extend from Murray Bridge right down to the border and which aims to stock and restore native species in waterways which were once a thriving section of our wonderful state. We also proposed many other projects which were all shut down by either the Minister or had to be run through the MRFAC. We had huge plans to run a tagging competition similar to the Million dollar Barra comp in NT which was not supported but rest assured we won't roll this up and throw it away as this is a project that has received huge support from many local businesses and most of all, the fishing community.

But oh, how things change...

Late in the financial year we saw the almost total collapse of the MRFAC with 6 of its original 9 members including the Chair, resigning from the committee, citing lack of support from government. RecFish SA have always maintained that while the MRFAC can play an important role in the management and development of recreational fishing, it can never replace RecFish SA as a correctly constituted, community based, independent Peak body, working for the benefit of recreational fishing. The MRFAC's and governments failure to understand that no government committee can ever replace a community-based organisation was clearly a significant factor in its demise.

The government has not totally abandoned the MRFAC and has attempted to reform it, this time with a clear agenda and the Independent Chair that was desperately needed. We are happy to say that RecFish SA has been invited to rejoin the MRFAC and help the Minister create a Recreational Fishing Strategy. This once again shows that RecFish SA exist for the right reasons and that we are 100% here to stay as the best organisation to represent the recreational angling community in South Australia.

I, as Chair of RecFish SA, will sit as a MRFAC member and bring our members concerns and thoughts to the Minister and ensure the Recreational Angling community is represented in the best way by the best people and I strongly believe this to be Recfish SA. We have a long way to go and with the depth of people we have that support our organisation we have got what it takes to get us there.

2020 saw new people come together and old issues thrown out the window which have coincided to build a bigger stronger and louder voice for the recs than we have ever seen before. This is the way we move forward by uniting and fighting a fight as one, not for personal glory but for the rights of every single recreational angler in South Australian. RecFish SA will continue in this role for as long as the recreational fishers of the state continue to support us.

The nomination shall be signed by the proposer and by the nominee.

Section 9.3 (f) If the number of Candidates:

- (i) is the same as the number of vacancies on the Board as advised under rule 9.3(b), the Candidates are deemed to be elected with effect from the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting;
- (ii) is less than the number of vacancies on the Board:
 - (a) the Candidates are deemed to be elected with effect from the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting; and
 - (b) the Board may fill the vacancies under rule 9.5;
- (iii) is greater than the number of vacancies on the Council, then an election by ballot must be held under rule 9.4.

Under these rules, all candidates are deemed to be elected to the board without a ballot being undertaken, effective from the conclusion of the 2020 AGM
